





This is a game where everyone can enjoy a variety of fun activities involving paper airplanes. It offers a mix of challenges to test your dexterity, creativity, and skill. It's perfect for anyone looking to engage in a fun, hands-on activity. Whether you're with friends or family, Paper Airplane Bingo is a great way to spend some time together, learn a bit about aerodynamics, and have some laughs. So grab some paper, and let's get started!

# How To Play

A paper airplane activity will be randomly selected from the included list. Each player will attempt to successfully complete the challenge. If they do, they can mark that square as completed. The first player to get five in a row (horizontally, vertically, or diagonally) wins!

# **Setup Instructions**

1) In this packet you will find 30 Bingo cards with 24 paper airplane challenges randomly distributed around the cards. The middle square is a freebie. Print as many Bingo cards as you need in order to give one to each player. If you have more than 30 players, you can print some duplicates.

2) Print one additional Bingo card and cut out the 24 challenges. Put them into a small box or other container where they can be mixed up and secretly selected one by one.

3) Give each player access to paper airplane supplies. This includes paper, pencils, rulers, tape, and anything else that you want to provide. Some activities have special requirements, so read through them ahead of time.



4) Now you can begin. If one person is acting as the judge they will draw a random challenge from the container and read it aloud. If everyone is playing, then rotate through each player, allowing everyone to have a turn at drawing a challenge from the box.

5) Give some time for each person to attempt the challenge. The judge or the group will determine if the player was successfull. If they were, they can mark off the square. Once everyone has attempted the challenge, draw another challenge. Keep going until someone wins!
